Hello Dakota Hospital Foundation members and friends!

I hope you are having a happy and prosperous 2023. Your board members have been busy here at the Dakota Hospital Foundation with an event filled first half of 2023.

Thanks to your generous support, we have given back much to our community with a focus on education, health, and wellness. At our annual leadership dinner, held this year on May 16, we provided \$13,250.00 in scholarships with most of the recipients pursuing careers in healthcare. Imagine the impact those scholars will have in their communities throughout their careers. Our community and others are certainly benefiting from the work of past scholarship recipients who have received education funding assistance from the Dakota Hospital Foundation since 2005, THANKS TO YOU!

We have funded grants for projects in our area since 2015. Growing up in a small town on the Sisseton Wahpeton Oyate of the Lake Traverse Reservation, she experienced a community that took pride in its people, even with limited resources. Rallving around those who deserve support and celebrating those who experience success, has been part of her outreach strategies to build a better tomorrow for all those around her.

Dawn Marie is a highly active leader in the Sioux Falls community. In 2022, she was appointed as a Commission on Human Relations member. Since

2021, she has served on the Bridging the Gap Community Foundation, SFSD Indian Education Parent Committee and graduated from the Leaders of Tomorrow leadership training.

Part of Dawn Marie's mission is to connect her and her community to Indigenous roots and history. In 2020, she was awarded the Dreamstarter Grant through Running Strong for American Indian Youth. She has offered traditional practices to her students and connected local elders to youth through this. Before this opportunity, Dawn Marie hosted several successful community events that featured local and national Indigenous artists, leaders, and entities.

Dawn Marie spent the last ten years supporting the school and after school organizations through her power of collaboration and partnerships. As an afterschool director, she was awarded the National Afterschool Association's Next Generation of Leaders in 2019 and recognized for her community work and professionalism by the University of South Dakota's 30 Under 30 Alumni Award and the 2022 Emerging Leader through the Alumni Achievement Awards. She graduated with her Master's in Social Work from the University of South Dakota in 2020.



She contributed much of her success to striving to set a positive example for her eight-yearold daughter, Rhayn Marie Villanueva Medrano.

2023 Community Healthcare Service Award

Each year Dakota Hospital Foundation recognizes a community member with the Community Health Service award. This year's Community Health Service award was presented to Mary Auch. The Community Health Service Award recognizes outstanding contributions of time, talent and resources benefiting the health of the community. We are pleased to present this award every year to someone in the community who we feel encompasses these values.

Mary has been the Registered Dietitian at Sanford Vermillion for the past

34 years. She started as a consultant working one or two days a week when the Care Center was still called "Southeastern South Dakota Nursing Home" and the hospital was "Dakota Hospital." Within 18 months, she became the director of the department, and saw the transition to leadership by Sioux Valley Hospital. Those were hard but good times of helping to develop excellent quality services in Dietary and the rest of the hospital. One of her craziest memories of those early days was developing all the recipes, writing all of them in pencil on recipe cards. Some of the recipes that were painstakingly written disappeared; it was a mystery where they could have gone. Several years later, when the elevator was being repaired, a worker brought Maintenance a wad of recipes that they found at the bottom of the elevator shaft. Apparently, when some cooks disliked making certain foods, they would throw the recipe down between the cracks in the elevator, thinking no one would ever find out! Mary remembers well the night of the Open House in 1993 when the new hospital building was opened, joining the hospital to the long-term care facility. It was the evening of the second birthday of her little boy, Matthew. Nine hundred people attended the event, curious to see the beautiful teal and mauve decorated facility. Without the assistance of many ladies in the community who made hundreds of hor d'oeuvres, the evening would not have been as much of a success. Although her home is in Centerville, her loyalty to the Vermillion community was sparked from their support.

In the last 30 years, she transitioned to focusing on clinical nutrition and watched all the building and renovation projects take place at Sanford. The changes in the building necessitated ten moves of

her office for what seemed to be very good reasons each time. She's now come full circle to one of the original offices she had, located in the service hallway across from the kitchen. Flexibility, a desire to downsize and humor enabled her to survive all the upheaval!

Mary was born in Indiana but grew up just outside of Chicago. She attended Messiah College in Pennsylvania, majoring in Home Economics. Within two months of graduating, she

began a three-year term of voluntary service in rural Bangladesh, teaching nutrition to some of the poorest people in the world who lived at that time in the 1980's. Her love of people from many different nations was born during that time. She met her husband Duane there, and they returned to South Dakota, where she pursued the necessary coursework in dietetics and a master's in nutrition at South Dakota State University.

Mary and Duane were blessed with four children. Jonathan was adopted from Korea as a toddler, and ten weeks later, their miracle baby, Matthew, was born. After nine years of marriage, becoming parents to two children changed everything. Julia was adopted two years later, also from Korea. The family seemed complete, but God had different plans and they had another surprise miracle baby at age 40, her son Peter.

After the sudden death of her youngest son at age 16, and working through all the grief that ensued, the "nest" was suddenly emptied. Working through the grief process led to writing her book, "Glorious Puzzle." She's used that free time to lead a grief support group for several years and started Global Friends, an organization that assists international students to adjust to life in Vermillion. She plans to spend much more time post-retirement with students. Visiting her two granddaughters in Georgia and her daughter living in Washington state, will provide ample time and opportunities for traveling.

Leadership Dinner Keynote Speaker

Caleb's passion and mission is to share the insights and lessons he has learned from his own journey—from being the first West Point football player to be drafted into the NFL while serving in the Army, to overcoming policy changes and returning to active duty, and ultimately realizing his NFL dream—illustrates how confronting fears, embracing change, and remaining authentic

His message is said to be a 'timely and crucial message' for today as we are facing unprecedented amounts of stress, pressure, and burnout.

When Caleb is not on a stage delivering a keynote, or working with leaders, he's at home trying to convince his partner, Kara, that their daughter, Sophie London, needs a Bernese Mountain Dog Puppy. As of now, his attempts have not been successful, but he refuses to accept defeat.



William Dendinger, MD Family Medicine Scholarship

In honor of Dr. William Dendinger and his many years of health care service to the Vermillion community, this scholarship endowment will provide a scholarship for a medical student accepted into a Family Medicine Residency Program and currently enrolled at USD Sanford School of Medicine.



Wanda and Tim Hannahs Scholarship

This scholarship endowment is in honor of Wanda and Tim Hannahs. Wanda was an employee of Sanford Vermillion who experienced a spinal cord injury after a car accident, which left her paralyzed.
