Todd Mechling

Mechling, an alumnus of University of South Dakota, has worked in the film/video production industry for over three decades. His production experience is extensive and wide-ranging: news, commercials, motion pictures, documentaries, children's programs, concerts, political campaigns, corporate and industrial communications, television magazines, stage adaptations.



After winning numerous directing awards for his dramas, documentaries and children's programs in the public television sector, Mechling formed his own production company - Cool Hand Production - in 1993. His clients have ranged from regional advertising agencies to multinational corporations and international production companies.

He returned to his alma mater as an instructor in the Media and Journalism Department in 2004. Mechling teaches Video Production, Advanced Field Production, and Directing for Video and Films, as well as advising KYOT-TV (the student-run television station) and Coyote Creative (a student-run production house).

"Within the course of my career there have been very few production roles that I haven't performed at one time or another. I've been a grip, a gaffer, a videographer, an editor, a director of photography, a lighting director, a location scout, a production manager, a producer, a director, and an executive producer.

I think that my students appreciate the fact that when I'm showing them how to plan a production or set-up a shot or light a scene or mic an interview, I'm drawing upon thirty-plus years of experience doing those very things. I'm sharing with them a lifetime of work in the film and video production trenches. And - as Cool Hand Production - I still climb into those trenches during the summer months. So, it's not like I'm teaching my students what production was like 'back in the day.' I'm training them for the current market. It's very rewarding to see a good number of my former students now out working in the marketplace...and excelling there."

Christopher A. Meyer

Christopher A. Meyer is a native South Dakotan and Associate Professor of Sculpture at his alma mater the University of South Dakota where he received his B.F.A. visual art degree emphasizing in sculpture. Meyer earned his M.F.A. in visual art emphasizing in sculpture graduating Suma Cum Laudi in December of 2003 from the University of Montana in Missoula, Montana.



Meyer's work ranges from non-objective to representational sculptural objects, sculptural installations and performance work often times focusing on the interaction between the viewer and the work. Christopher's studio practice tends to emphasize material and process and is made from a large variety of materials including carved or fabricated wood, steel, fibers, cast metals, mixed media or "whatever the piece needs to be." Or in the case of *Assembly*, hands molded from over 150 Vermillion community members. Recently, he has begun a deeper investment in cast iron, building a furnace and equipment necessary to cast the material and hosting an annual iron pour at his home studio in rural South Dakota called the "Little Pour on the Prairie" each spring. Meyer is also on the Board of Directors for the Western Cast Iron Art Alliance since March 2016.

Meyer has exhibited in over 100 regional and national exhibitions since joining the University of South Dakota in 2006. Some of Meyer's selected exhibitions include: The Bemis Contemporary Art Center's 2012 Regional Juried Exhibition in Omaha, Nebraska; The Kinsey Institute's 2013 International Juried Art Exhibition in Bloomington, Indiana; National Iron, a juried professional exhibition associated with the 2014 Western Cast Iron Art Alliance Conference in Laramie, Wyoming where his work received "Best of Show;" and in 2015 fired: Iron a national juried exhibition part of a series of three exhibitions of medias requiring fire in their process at the Arvada Center for the Arts and Humanities in Arvada, Colorado. His work was also published in the winter 2016 vol. 31 of *Studio Visit*, an international juried publication of all medias of Fine Art by the Open Studio Press of Boston, Massachusetts. This past May, he had a solo exhibition of his installation and cast iron sculpture at Frontier Space, an alternative non-profit gallery space in Missoula, Montana.

Meyer works and lives with his family consisting of his wife, two children, two dogs and way too many cats on an acreage full of materials somewhere northwest of Vermillion, South Dakota.

Evelyn Schlenker

Evelyn Schlenker is a Professor Emeritus having been a faculty member at the University of South Dakota Medical School for over 36 years. She also has a deep interest in the history of Clay County and wrote four books. Two documented the unique and beautiful stained glass windows at the old St. Agnes Church (now the Washington Street Arts Center)



in Vermillion, and windows in St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Wakonda. Both churches were built in the early part of the twentieth century. Having an interest in medicine and historical preservation, she wrote a book about Stansbury's houses. Dr. Eugene Stansbury practiced medicine in Vermillion in the first half of the 20th century, taught in the medical school, and was a great supporter of the Dakota Hospital, Vermillion's first community hospital. The fourth book that Schlenker wrote documents houses that served as hospitals prior to the construction of the Dakota Hospital, the challenge the Dakota Hospital Association faced and overcame to build and maintain the hospital, and lastly the development of the healthcare campus in Vermillion. Schlenker is on the board and serves as secretary of the South Dakota Shakespeare Festival, the Vermillion Community Theater, Friends of the W. H. Over Museum (celebrating its 135th year), and the Clay County Historical Preservation Commission.

I marvel at the endurance, patience and good will of the hundreds of individuals who made this project come to life. It is a testament to our commitment to serve each otherwith our strength, our vulnerability, our resilience. Art can give us a unique way to celebrate our community and give thanks to the stewards of our health and wellness, across the whole life spectrum.
